JOURNALING FOR THE BEGINNING ARTIST & NON-ARTIST - Certificate Elective

If you've never made a journal before (but always wanted to), this is a great time to try it! This kind of journaling doesn't require drawing—or writing. It's about collecting, arranging, and decorating. Draw or write as much as you want, but definitely plan to enhance, decorate, and embellish. Add color and metallic effects, explore techniques like stamping, texturing, glazing and collage. Choose a subject or theme that interests you and create a rich visual record that you can keep and enjoy.

COLORED PENCIL I 🎓

One of our most popular classes! Get started with the joys of colored pencil the right way! Learn how to use colored pencils from the ground up while you gain an in-depth knowledge of the basics. Get acquainted with your pencils, practice different methods of application, explore color, and experience the unique effects that only the colored pencil can create. Easy exercises, copious handouts, examples and demos, along with unique presentations provide you with first-hand knowledge as you explore the world of the colored pencil.

Create a solid foundation for your art by "learning to see." Break things down into simple elements and maximize each mark you put on your paper. Discussions, demonstrations, fun exercises, and personalized help are included in each class. Create work with greater impact as you focus on the basics of drawing.



CREATIVE WATERCOLOR FROM PHOTOGRAPHS - Certificate Elective

Many artists do it- but it is a challenge to perfect this method. This course takes you through the full journey from choosing the subject and taking the photos to the final stroke of the artist's hand. Learn the challenges and benefits of combining photos, principles of composition, tricks to transferring that information to your ground, and how to use photographs as a tool without being dependent on them. Work through each step of the process with examples provided by the instructor, personal attention and positive feedback.

TRAINING YOUR EYE: A NEW PERSPECTIVE

The illusion of space on a two-dimensional surface is fun to create and easy to do. The emphasis of this class is on building the visual skills needed to interpret spatial and linear perspective: an effective method that will shift how you approach and render more challenging subjects. Nothing to fear here, folks! Grab a pencil and be prepared for some fun exercises designed to help you master the techniques of a convincing, realistic image. Watch instructor demonstrations then experiment with a number of different methods while you learn to accurately observe and translate your subject to the paper with convincing realism. Individual and expert attention during the class will boost confidence while you draw a variety of perspectives with ease. The last day of class might be spent at off-campus for an exciting field trip day of drawing.

Whether you are a photographer using a digital camera, or a painter who takes digital photos for reference or for documenting your paintings, knowing what to do with your digital images after taking the shot is essential. Learn to use Adobe Photoshop Elements 14- a low cost yet powerful tool for basic digital image processing. Beginners will learn easy ways to correctly size images for either printing or emailing, remove color tints, use layers, select parts of one image to add to another (great for making reference photos to paint from), retouch, get rid of red eye, add text and find out how to "rescue" a poorly exposed photograph. Wish you hadn't taken the family reunion photograph with that telephone pole sticking out of the top of your kid's head? It's an easy fix in Photoshop! If you are ready to take the next step with your digital photographs this "beginner friendly" class is for you.

Good nature illustration begins with a good foundation, so we will begin with anatomy basics of Sonoran Desert bird species. Physical characteristics show us not only form but also indicate the function of many distinguishing forms and gestures. We'll compare types of birds, their color and physical adaptations that allow them to survive and flourish in their habitat. Enjoy studying from the Desert Museum collection and get close and personal with live birds that will visit the classroom. Sketches, drawings and paintings combine to provide evidence of our journey to a deeper understanding of these poetic creatures.

COMMANDING CAMERA COMPOSITION 🖸 🛅

Denman will focus on the pre-work necessary to ensure a successful painting and effectively approaching challenging textures such as feathers and fur. Students may bring their own reference photos, but the instructor will have additional photos on hand at the workshop.

TABLE TOP PHOTOGRAPHY FOR ARTISTS & PHOTOGRAPHERS

Learn to use a simple "kitchen table" set up to photograph small objects and still life arrangements. Artists - become more proficient at taking your own reference photos of botanical specimens, shells, skeletal structures etc. Photographers- if you can't always get out into the field for your photography you can do really interesting work right at home by arranging still life set up's and photographing them- it's an art form in itself. This is a beginning level class with no experience necessary. We will start with an overview of basic camera function and review the pros and cons of different cameras and lenses. We will use simple set up's that you can duplicate at home at little or no cost. Please bring to class whatever

camera you have. If you have a tripod you can bring that too. You are welcome to bring small objects you are interested in photographing or simply choose from the many natural objects the museum will provide for you such as plants, skulls, feathers, and dried saguaro blossoms.

INTERCHANGEABLE LENS CAMERA QUICKSTART

If you have a camera that you can take the lens off of, then you have an interchangeable lens camera! These types of cameras have unique settings not found on most "point and shoot" type cameras but they can be confusing to understand. This one day class will explain which primary settings and controls are the most important to know about and how to use them. What is "depth of field" and how is it controlled? How do f-stops, shutter speeds and ISO all work together? The importance of resolution and sensor size, lenses and lot's more will be discussed in beginner friendly terms. Get the most out of your interchangeable lens camera by taking full advantage of its many robust features- after all you paid for them!

INTRO TO NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY: THE BASICS 🖸

Taking great photographs of our amazing desert southwest is both fun and rewarding but using today's complex digital cameras can be a challenge for the beginner. This introductory class will provide you with a solid foundation in the fundamentals of digital photography. Starting with an overview of camera types, equipment and accessories you will have a much firmer idea of what equipment you may- or may not need. You will receive coherent explanations of camera functions such as f/ stops, shutter speeds, light metering, setting proper resolution, file formats Raw vs Jpeg, white balance, depth of field and more. Enjoy working on location at the Desert Museum under the guidance of your instructor while practicing what you have studied in class. This is a beginner friendly class and is also very thorough. Begin taking the quality photographs you wanted to when you bought that nice digital camera!



KIWANDA: OIL PAINTING WITH KENYAN WILDLIFE ARTIST GUY

COMBES ☆ - Certificate Elective Instructor: Guy Combes Prerequisite: Oil painting, drawing & color mixing experience Fee: \$200 museum members/\$250 nonmembers Dates: Sat, Sun & Mon | 9 - 3pm | Oct 29, 30 & 31

Back by popular demand! Guy Combes brings Africa into the studio for a 3 day Kiwanda (workshop)! Whether you've experienced a safari first hand or not, Guy will inspire you with his passion for his homeland enough for you to leave feeling as though you have. This workshop will consist of practical demonstrations of oil painting techniques, including composition, drawing, image transfer, underpainting, color use and rendering of natural texture in oil. He will provide a library of reference images prior to the workshop for students to prepare

in advance if desired, and a recommended materials list. Guy will share some of his unique studio methods, including a demonstration of tablet technology that is revolutionizing the way artists work. He will outline what inspires him and how he gathers material in the field for use in the studio. The workshop will also include a talk about conservation in East Africa; specifically Soysambu Conservancy, a 48,000 acre multi-use ranch in the Great Rift Valley, for which Guy is US Development Director.

IN NATURE III - Certificate Elective Instructor: Catherine Nash Prerequisite: None Fee: \$105 museum members/\$155 nonmembers Dates: Sat & Sun | 10 - 4pm | Oct 29 & 30

Celebrate our unique Sonoran Desert through a series of sketching and journaling exercises as you learn how to capture intimate experiences in nature using pen, watercolor pencils, collage and writing. Draw and paint, record questions and observations, label particular species, write about your feelings as you create multiple pages of colorful encounters with wildflowers, cacti, animals, birds and the beautiful desert landscape. Nature journaling can be a playful, creative and inspiring way to develop observational abilities and record

expressive and meaningful outdoor experiences. You have the chance to capture the feeling of a particular moment: conjuring up smells, sounds of birds, the feel of the wind and warmth of sunlight on one's skin, a visceral memory in nature that can be enjoyed for years to come. The focus in this nature journaling workshop is to relax, take a closer look, notice, wonder, and enjoy the moment while having creative fun in the desert.



PLEIN AIR PAINTING WITH WATERCOLOR III - Certificate Elective Instructor: Rick Wheeler

Prerequisite: None Fee: \$150 museum members/\$200 nonmembers Dates: Fri, Sat & Sun | 10 - 4pm | Nov 4, 5 & 6

As in the long tradition of outdoor painting, this class focuses on painting on location, aka 'Plein Air' painting. In this case we'll be using traditional transparent watercolor, with the Desert Museum grounds as subject matter. The class will cover the technique of working light to dark, whether or not to sketch your subject first, and the pleasure of loose, more impressionistic painting styles. Instructor will provide group demos of various techniques, while also giving students one-on-one instruction. The class is intended for beginning to intermediate watercolor and/or plein air painters.

DESERT PATTERNS IN SILK 15 Instructor: Holly Swangstu Fee: \$145 museum members/\$195 nonmember

Prerequisite: None Dates: Sat & Sun | 9 - 3pm | Nov 5 & 6

Introduce yourself to the exciting art of silk painting in this 2-day workshop held on the beautiful grounds of the Desert Museum. You will learn about professional silk dyes, how to mix, apply and set the dye using two age old techniques: The Arashi Shibori technique where you wrap the fabric on a pole to create a design, and the Serti method where you paint directly on stretched fabric to create more intricate paintings. The instructor will personalize both methods to meet the needs of each unique student, making the studio time fun and challenging for someone who desires instant gratification and for the person who prefers a more detailed project. This workshop will take you through the process of creating your idea and patterns to produce professional outcomes . Come join Holly who has taught silk painting for all ages and levels for over 20 years. All supplies included in the fee for 2 silk scarves. Additional scarf blanks will be available for purchase during the workshop.



Painterly work tends not to be 'overworked,' meaning the brushstroke is visible and the painted surface has texture. Painterly painting is common among plein air painters, or painters from life, due to the fast changing natural light. In our case, we'll be applying the painterly technique, but from the use of photographs. The instructor will provide several of his own photos for student use, but encourages students to bring in some of their own, or someone's photo they've been given permission to use. Our goal as painters is not to copy the photograph, but to 'interpret' the photo in terms of the application of paint (thick and thin), the use of good composition, and color choices. We can almost always improve upon the photo in creating a good painting. The instructor will demonstrate.





The unique backdrop of the Museum becomes your class-room while you have the option of drawing birds, mammals, insects and desert botanicals. You can also participate in a wide variety of classes and workshops including oil painting, nature journaling, mixed media and photography.

Experienced, professional artists provide individual instruction in the classroom setting located in the museum's Baldwin Education Building. Whether you sample a few classes or complete the certificate program, you will increase your appreciation and knowledge of the desert!

REQUIRED COURSES

The following courses are required if you wish to receive a Certificate of Completion in Nature Art and the recommended sequence of courses may vary per individual. If you enroll with previous experience you may schedule a portfolio appointment with the Director for the possibility of waiving core classes. Core classes waived due to proven ability may be replaced with electives. Most courses consist of exercises, critiques, demonstrations and homework assignments. A list of supplies for each course is available in the Art Institute office and will be sent with your class confirmation.

ELECTIVE COURSES

Elective courses are designed to increase the participant's knowledge, ability and experience in nature art and beyond. In addition to the required courses, you must complete at least 100 hours of elective classes. Workshops and classes that count toward the Nature Art Certificate are noted as certificate elective courses in the catalog. Photography courses are not a part of the Nature Art Certificate Program at this time and are considered Non-Certificate electives.

PORTFOLIO REVIEW

Upon completion of all coursework, you will be ready for the portfolio review. Call the Art Institute Director for more information (520) 883-3082 or go online to www.desertmuseum.org/arts.

The Nature Art Program must be completed in its entirety in order to receive a Certificate. Eighty percent of a class must be attended in order to receive credit for that class. The pace of the program depends on the individual. Certificates are awarded each spring in conjunction with an annual student art exhibition.
