Materials List

1 each of the following pencils: HB, 2B, 2H

1 eraser: 'kneaded' eraser recommended (or eraser of your choice)

1 5 x 7 drawing pad: the Art Institute provides these free of charge (additional Art Institute pads are available for \$5 each)

1 small watercolor pad: these are available through the Art Institute for \$5 each (or purchase a 140lb. 5x7", 6x9", or 7x10" brand of your choice) The watercolor pads are for use during the ink wash and watercolor portion of the class.

1 bottle of permanent ink: black (Pelican or Higgins) or sepia/brown (Walnut drawing ink is a good one)

1 permanent ink pen: size 05 (Micron brand recommended)

1 each watercolor brush: #6 Round and ½" Flat (synthetic is fine)

1 small watercolor set (Winsor Newton suggested) – these are compact box sets, with a lid and a place for mixing colors. The Art Institute has small sets for purchase during class for \$20.

OR, if you prefer working with tubes of paints:

1 each of small tubes (.17 fl. oz.) of watercolors

Alizarin Crimson

Cadmium Orange

Cad Yellow Medium

Ultramarine Blue

Burnt Umber

Hookers Green Deep or Sap Green

Winsor Newton is recommended – their student grade, known as "Cotman" is suggested for beginners. With individual tubes of paint you will also need one small palette with lid for outdoor use.
