## **Texas Tuberose**

## Manfreda maculosa

**DESCRIPTION:** Also known as Spice Lily, Texas Tuberose is a semi-succulent perennial native to Southern Texas and Mexico. It grows nearly flat to the ground, forming a rosette of fleshy, 1' long leaves. The sword-shaped leaves that are marked with round reddish-purple to dark brown spots. In the spring long flower spikes to 6' tall appear. Flowers are 2" long and cream to greenish-white in color, fading to pinkish. They are mildly fragrant. Once established, this plant can survive even the driest years by going drought deciduous.

**RECOMMENDED USE:** Group plantings give an interesting groundcover effect. It can be in a patio pot if it is a deep containers that will give adequate space to this plant's extensive root system.

## **CULTURE:**

160 m

**Hardiness**: At least 16°F.



Sun tolerance: Plant in full sun to light shade



**Watering and feeding**: Plants look best if planted in full sun and allowed to dry out prior to the next irrigation.



**Soil requirements**: Grow best in a well-drained soil.



**Pruning**: Remove older leaves that usually die back in winter.
